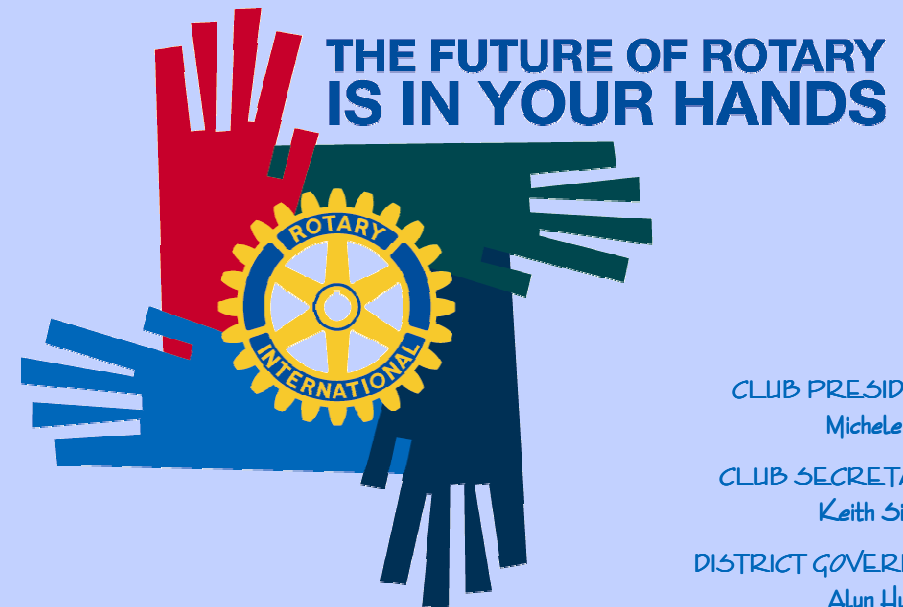

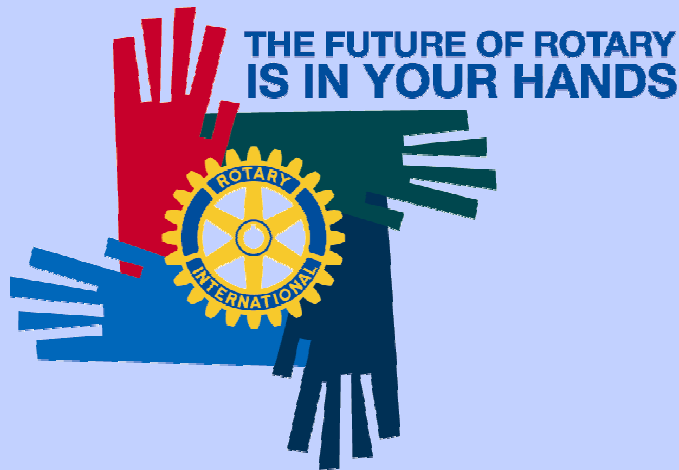

QUEST SPEAKER

Pauline Oates—Palliative Care

Chairman Tim introduced our speaker giving us a little bit of History about Pauline's personal life and her nursing career: Pauline hales from Cowell, she has five children and eight grandchildren. Before joining Palliative Care in 2002 Pauline had a long history in the wards and in theatre.

Pauline is 'truly dedicated to her vocation and loves it.' There are not many nurses who are suited to work in Palliative Care.

Palliative Care is about caring for those who have a terminal illness or are at end of life, ensuring they are pain free and have quality of life. It is not just about people who have Cancer. More recently Pauline has been working with younger people, it is no longer just about elderly people. Pauline also told us it is not just about her and the nurses at the hospital, they work in collaboration with many people to keep their patients in an environment of their choice. Everyone is an individual and while the majority of people may want to die at home, there are some; and Pauline gave the example of a woman who did not want to die at home because it would be too hard for her family in the future. In situations like this, and it is not rare, Pauline and her team are able to direct the patient's care to the Hospice room at the Hospital.

In the past Palliative Care has sat with the Domiciliary Care team as it has been seen to be a community based service. It is now with the Clinical side of the Whyalla Hospital and has three part time nurses.

Pauline is just about to complete a two year scholarship in oncology and next year will go overseas to the United Kingdom on a sixteen day seminar which she also won through the Pal Care fellowship. Her closing remarks were "It is a worthwhile and magnificent job to have and I enjoy it very much"
