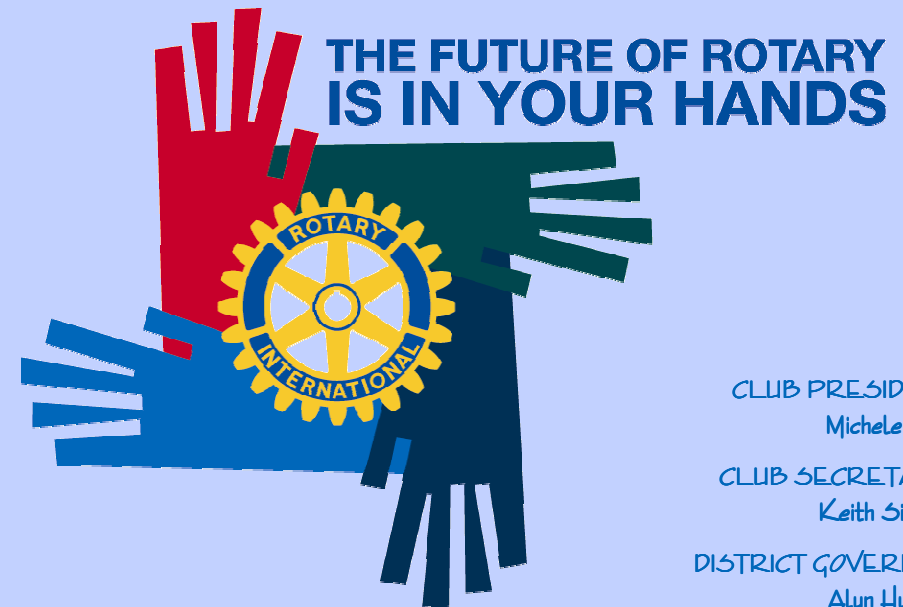

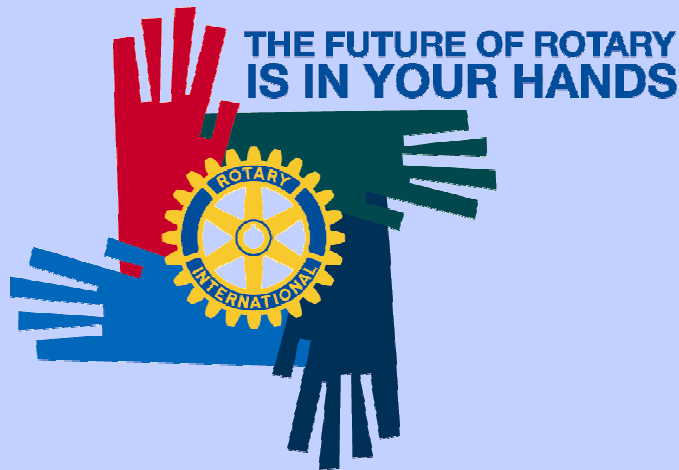

**GUEST SPEAKER**

Clint Garrett—Climate Change on the Eyre Peninsula



Marg Garrett had been asked to be our speaker tonight but due to the short notice and the fact that Margaret was at Government House, at a reception to mark her induction onto the women's Honour Roll, she had to decline. Not to worry though Clint offered to step up to the plate — but with the garb our speaker was wearing it was just a little bit hard to tell if it was Marg or Clint. I must admit the cream skirt and the purple top were quite becoming. Following much hilarity we did get down to the serious business of Climate Change. Our speaker reminded us not to confuse the hole in the Ozone Layer with Climate Change. He went on to reassure us that the hole in the Ozone layer will have healed itself by 2050. Clint made this a convincing presentation citing the CSIRO's evidence for climate change; Global temperature & Sea Levels have risen significantly since 1900; Past 11 yrs are amongst the 12 warmest since 1850; Increasing number of intense rainfall events; Increasing level of water vapour in the atmosphere since 1980; Oceans are becoming more acidic as they absorb more CO₂; Glaciers are retreating in many areas; Arctic sea ice is decreasing both in area and thickness; Shifts in animal and plant locations and behaviour. There were many questions asked during the presentation, which raised discussion around changing from cropping to grazing; carbon taxes; improving energy efficiency; changing peoples lifestyles. And yes we should act now.
