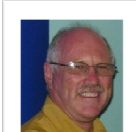
🔵 **Terry** — It was our visiting Rotarian Terry Metcalfe's birthday. He got a resounding rendition of Happy Birthday.

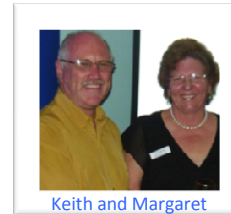

Margaret Garrett—Lifeline

Keith and Margaret

This week we have the real Marg, not the imposter of three of weeks ago. Marg is the Board Chair of Lifeline in our area. Lifeline is Australia wide founded through Wesley Missions. There are 42 Lifeline Centres operating in 60 locations Australia wide, it offers a wide range of services which varies from place to place. Some milestones of Lifeline include: 1977—Opened in Port Pirie; 1979—offered a 24hr service; 1983—Opened in Whyalla; 1985 Opened in Port Augusta and formed Lifeline Spence Gulf Inc.; 1989/91—Lifeline Crises Response operated; 2008—Lifeline Coast to Coast. The head branch in in Port Augusta where there are paid staff but all counsellors are volunteers. The training of the counsellors is extensive and they are required to prove they are keeping up their skills. There is experienced trainers and the certificate is portable. An expectation of the counsellors is to commit 100hrs per year on the phones. A small percentage of calls are about suicide, the majority of calls are about relationship issues. Counsellors will intervene to save a life. Issues include relationship; grief and loss; suicide intervention; substance misuse; mental health issues; family violence. There are also a lifeline shops staffed by volunteers. Volunteers are their biggest asset. As Marg puts it **'Volunteering is infectious and addictive'**
