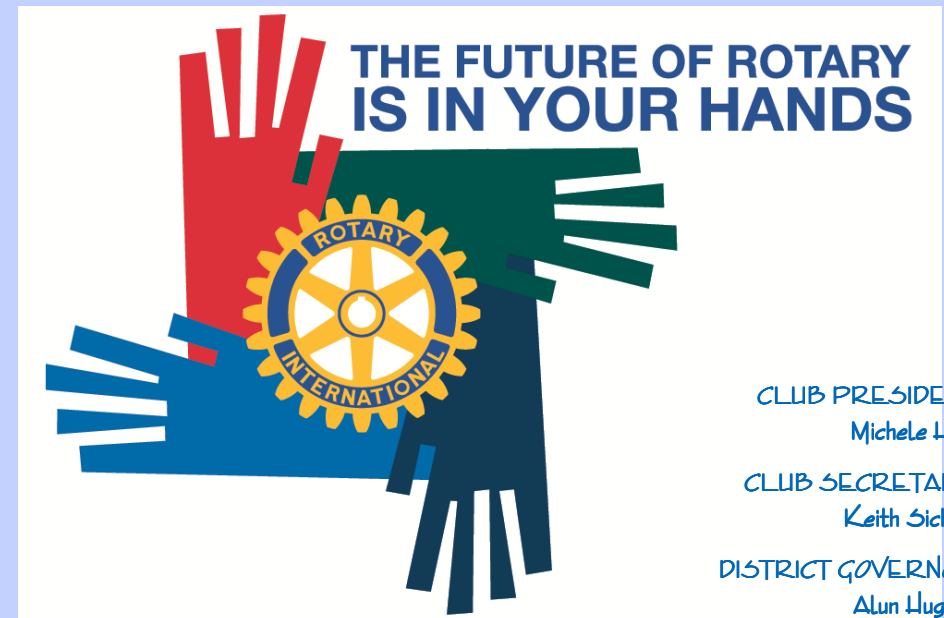
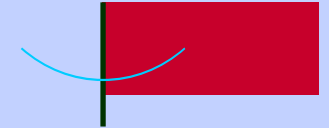
ATTENDANCE and APOLOGIES

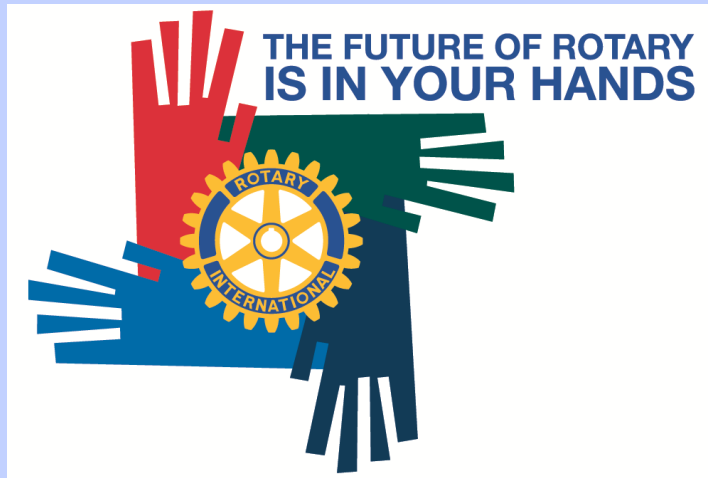

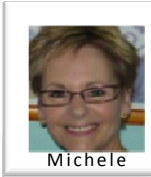

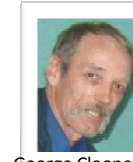

David Dunn—My Life

David started his working life in BHP as an apprentice Boilermaker / Welder. This was a great training ground and after working there for 7/8 years knew the whole plant like the back of his hand. From there, in 1978, he went to work at Santos and went to Moomba. In 1990 Merridy was pregnant with Tom and David returned to Whyalla to work. David went on to tell us about the various jobs he has had, most giving him great satisfaction and some giving him a great deal of grief and worry. His current position with the Hospital is fairly new to him, the biggest port folio is maintenance which is changing dramatically and the biggest challenge is hotel services. David is looking forward to working in this job for a long time.

David's array of skills has taken him to many areas and it was refreshing to hear such a truthful account of all aspects of his life.
