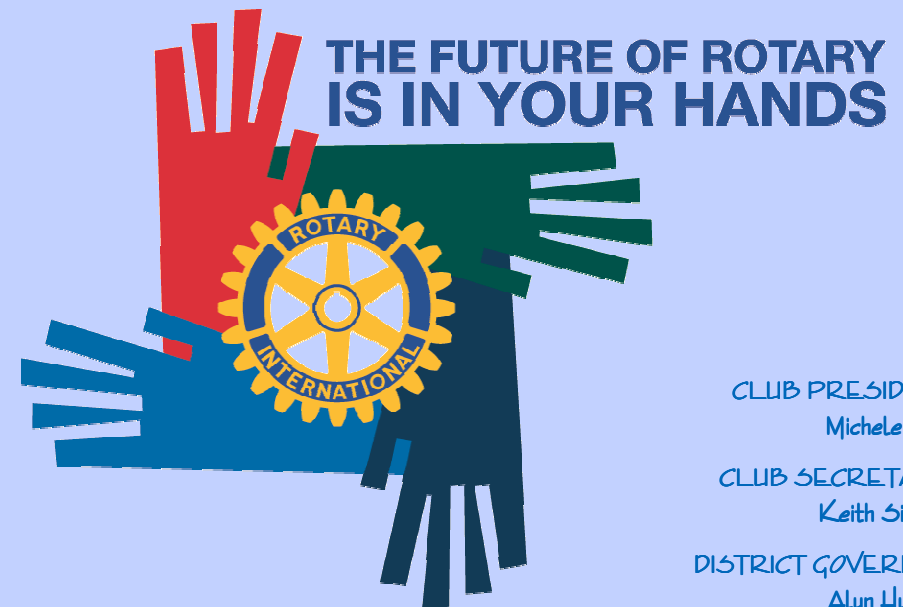
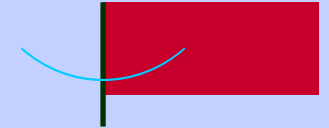

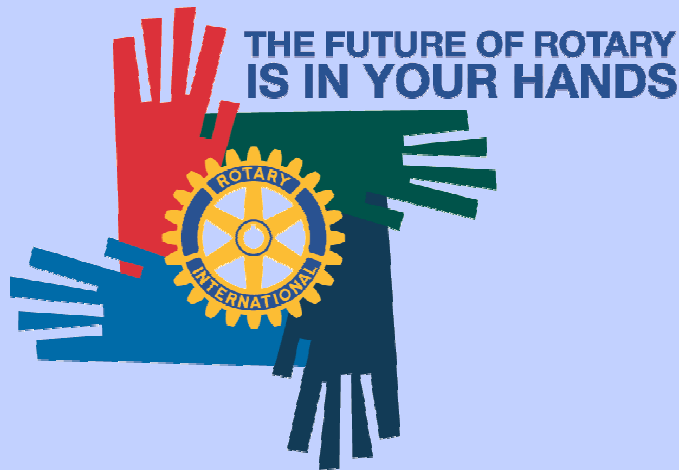

2009-91st Anniversary

The trustees of the Foundation, in 2005, set out to develop a ten year plan to move the Foundation toward its second century of service. The Future Vision Plan is designed to:

- Simplify Foundation programs and processes consistent with the new Mission Statement
- Focus Rotarian service efforts where they will have the greatest impact by addressing priority world needs that are relevant to Rotarians.
- Offer program options to help achieve both global and local goals.
- Increase a sense of ownership at both a district and club levels by transferring more decisions to districts.
- Gain more understanding of The Foundation's work and enhance rotary's public image.

In 2009, 100 districts have been selected as pilot districts. After three years it will be introduced world wide. It will be fully implemented by 2016-17, in time for the celebration of the Foundation's Centenary. The new model will be :

- **Simpler**
- **More cost effective**
- **Require significant Rotarian involvement**
- **Have sustainable outcomes and are**
- **Consistent with the Foundation's Mission**

QUEST SPEAKER

John Holds—Rotary Foundation

November is International Rotary Foundation Month and John kindly offered to talk to the meeting about it. He talked to us on a number of aspects which interest him about the Foundation. As a club we raise funds essential for our community, and we need encouragement to send some of it out of town. Some of us might say charity begins at home. It is sometimes hard to get our head around the funding etc, involving incredibly large amounts to money, John talked simply and at length about what Rotary is doing around the world. In the past this has been hard to comprehend but John made it easy for us to understand. “We used to have exchange students every year, how long has it been since we had exchange students?” “We are running the risk of not doing enough.” John also told us that there are fairly major changes in the Rotary Policy and we will see more in our district. Last year 350 Rotarians were involved in the Centurion Scheme, which raised \$35,000. The exchange program is very important. Promotion of Rotary is also important. Some ask what is happening in Foundation, John hopes to keep feeding information back to the club, to keep us informed.
