'FAIM in the Solomon Islands. A retrospective' was the Heading on the Title Page of Brian's presentation. It went back about twenty years, the first time Brian had been in the tropics. Then when he saw the destruction the Cyclones had left, he was determined to return to help. OH Yes, it was a much younger Brian in the photographs. This was when Brian first became involved with Rotary. They were asking for volunteers but Brian, at that time was not a Rotarian but they accepted his offer and off he went. In all he has been back about 12 times to help build schools etc. He told us about being in Honiara and walking down to the markets at night and feeling it was the safest place he had ever been. He showed us pictures of the showers and toilets that had been specially built for them; of families; of the little boats where the rats ate the rations. While this was hard work its was very rewarding and that came across in Brian's presentation. This Bulletin Editor has to admit it was so interesting she forgot to take notes a lot of the time.
