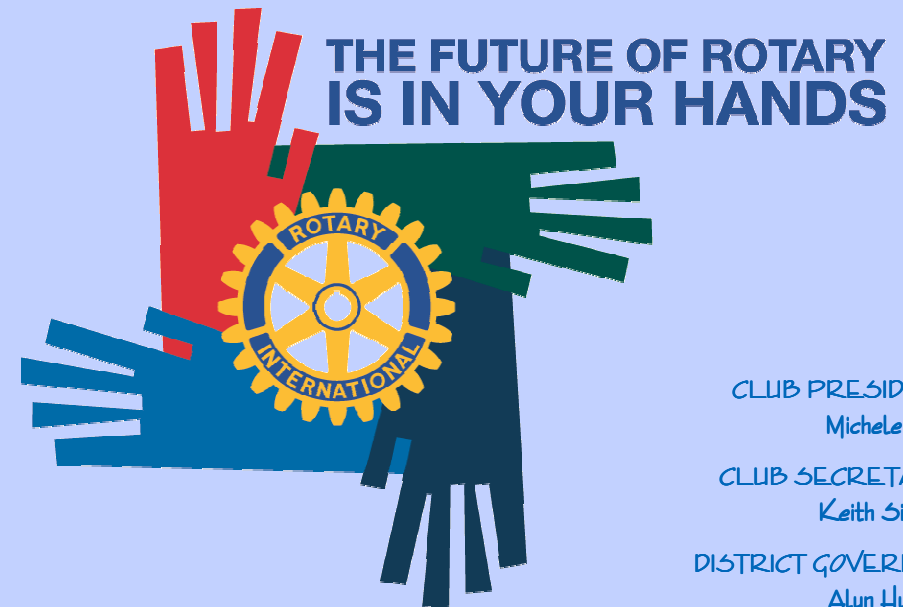
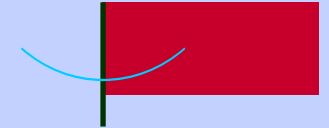

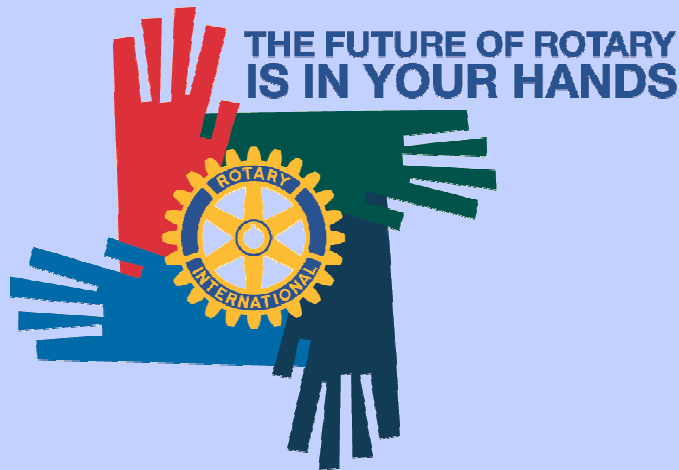

QUEST SPEAKER

Mark Tempany & Alison Hams — Making a CD



Mark and Alison are well known, professional musicians, in Whyalla, with a wealth of experience under their belt. They profess to be 'jack of all trades', not only have they recorded many CD's themselves and teach children music but they now have their own recording studio. Firstly they gave us a little background on themselves and how they came to feel quite settled here in Whyalla. Then they went on to present 'Making a CD' by Stormfront productions. 'First you need the songs. Writing your own songs can be a challenging and emotional process but hearing them come to life in the studio makes it all worthwhile'. The presentation went on to tell us about the need to register songs with APRA to protect your copyright. The process for making a CD includes—finding a recording studio; hiring musicians; recording the rhythm section; once the instruments have been recorded it's time for the vocals. 'Vocals are usually the hardest musical instrument to capture'. Today's digital technology makes amazing things possible. Once you have recorded all your instruments for all your songs it's time to put your producer's cap on and start mixing and mastering—this is where all the hard work comes together. Then if you want to release a professional album you'll need to find a CD manufacturer. After this it's photographs and publicity. All a piece of cake if you ask me..... Mark and Alison's aim for their presentation was to generate lots of questions. This, they did very successfully.
