Paul Beaty

The Bottle Depot.

The title of Paul's talk threw some people, it was not about bottle recycling, it is a website he has started. He is a bottle collector.

His hobby started when he was 8 years old and has grown steadily since, to the stage of having 3 or 4 thousand.

He reckoned, that to keep his collection within bounds, he would concentrate on South Australian specimens.

He explained how he gathers these bottles, some as gifts, some purchased from E-Bay and many he digs up from old tips etc in different parts of the of the State Paul demonstrated a metal rod he uses as a probe and some bottles can be found using a metal detector.

There was apparently three soft drink ,or as they were called aerated water bottlers and one milk bottler in Whyalla in the early years of the town.

The bottles from one of them, HG Shelley can sell for as much as \$250 00.

Paul passed around various samples of the bottles he collects, both glass and pottery and answered several questions.
