## ShelterBox

Baby Regina is five months old. She lies on the concrete floor, flies circle her sleeping form. Her home was destroyed when the River Niger burst its banks in Niamey, the capital of the West African country Niger. Regina is currently living in a school and being cared for by the local community. Her father searches for work in the flood-hit city each day. Before the floods struck, Regina's mother died of lung disease. 'It breaks your heart,' said ShelterBox Response Team (SRT) member Tom Lay. 'Regina's story puts everything into perspective. 'These conditions are cramped and overcrowded. There's no comfort at all. The most vulnerable sleep inside on the concrete floors while others sleep outside with only branches and mosquito nets for shelter.' Tom, and fellow SRT members Mike Freeman (US) and Ed Owen (UK), have been working with Rotarians and the fire service to distribute an initial 200 ShelterBoxes to the families in most need. 50 tents have already been set up at a youth centre and families will be moving into them during the coming days. 'The fire service is heading up the relief effort and they've been fantastic,' added Tom. 'There's real pressure to get people out of the schools where they're sheltering before next week when the schools are due to reopen. 'In the next few days we'll be setting up 150 more tents at a second site we've identified. There's a huge need out here and the flood waters are still rising.' A further 200 ShelterBoxes and four Classrooms in a Box are being sent to Niger. The four Classrooms in a Box will provide school equipment for 200 children and essential equipment for teachers. These boxes are despatched on requests from SRTs, typically when schools have been destroyed in a disaster.
