## CLINT GARRETT—WALKING IN THE FLINDERS

In his introduction Rotarian John H. reminded us that one of Clint's passions is living in this part of the world and the Flinders Ranges. Apart from being disappointed in the colour of his slides on the screen his first comments about the Flinders Ranges went along the lines of— some people have never been to the Ranges "Poor Bastards—we need to get them out there". To say that Clint is passionate about the Ranges is an understatement, the sheer bliss he portrays is infectious and makes you just want to be there. We saw slides of Corunna Gorge before the rain then after the rain with all the waterfalls; then there was walks in the Southern Flinders; Mount Remarkable National Park; Alligator Gorge; Hidden Gorge is 'quite nice and pretty.' Clint showed us the Narrows where he goes to see the beautiful Orchids. It was round about now when he was talking that I have written in my notes 'What pleasure Clint has talking about the Gorge, with a huge smile on his face'.....

Edieowie Gorge was next, then Mount Hayward and a story about his childhood and how he became the independent person he is. From there he took us to the Flora and the Fauna of this spectacular country. At Bunyip Chasm he fell hurting his hand— "a bit uncomfy" he reports. He closed with the statement "Walking in the Flinders Ranges takes you to some beautiful places"
