Scott Denny

Sapol

Scott is a Police Inspector and is second in charge of the Eyre and Western Districts, he is based in Whyalla and his Superintendent is based in Port Lincoln.

There are fourteen out stations in the region, stretching to the West Aust. Border This entails plenty driving and he reckoned that he had travelled over 10,000kms in the previous two weeks..

Scott was born and raised in Adelaide ,and after different types of employment, he join the Police Service in the Early 90's .

He has worked in most aspects of the Service, foot patrols, plain clothes work, traffic and he was in charge of the Hindley Street precinct.

He has studied and obtained several university degrees.

Scott then spoke on Whyalla and the policing here, we have a full compliment of sixty five officers.

They have 7 cars on the road at any one time, plus back-up. We will be having a dedicated Highway patrol car in the area.

Their main focus is on drugs, though he said it is not a major problems, since May there have been fourteen drug arrests, mainly for cannabis, the largest haul was 900 grams and 25 grams of methamphetamine.

There has also been 5 weapon seizures. There are two Bikie groups in the town, but are not a major problem.

There are on average, 5-6 house breaks a week and Scott explained, that if there is a break in in a specific area, the Police call on all known "criminals" in that area.

One area of concern is the number of "Hoons", as there seems to be more young people with V8 cars, though the local car impoundment area is fairly full.

His aim is to work proactively with the young people in the area.

Overall, Scott reckoned that the crime rate in Whyalla compares very well with other areas of the State.

In answer to a question from Keith, on our running the Driver Awareness Programme, Scott said that they would co-operate as required.
