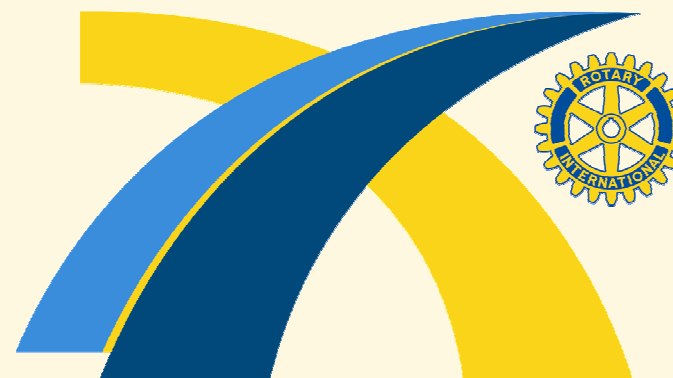

Multiple Sclerosis

Fiona, who is a local Real Estate Agent, spoke about her experience with this illness.

She has been officially diagnosed for about a year, but her problem started a year before that. She woke up with a very painful right eye and was unable to see properly.

The initial diagnosis was either glaucoma or an infection behind her eye.

This was treated for this for several months at the Royal Adelaide, before she had a MRI which showed that she had plaque on her brain stem, which is what M/S is.

This illness effects different people differently and there is no cure as such.

One problem that Fiona has, is controlling her body temperature, which appears to be quite a common problem amongst people with M/S

As a working mum, Fiona manages her condition with injections and is able to carry on with her life.

Her attitude to her condition is very positive and she said that she can get plenty of support from organisations like the M/S Society.
