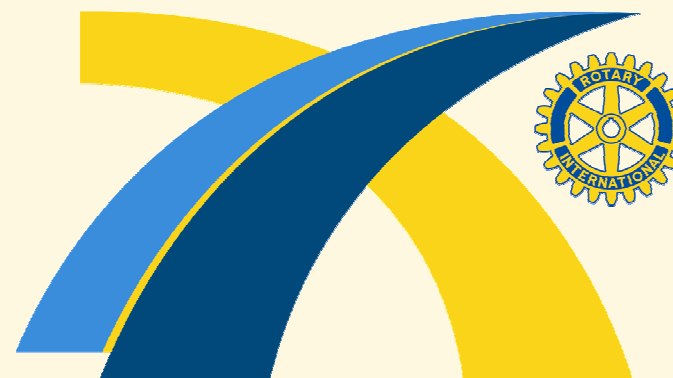

Alistair Muir

The Mullaquanna Project

Alistair was a Whyalla resident from 1996 till 1978, as his father was GP in the town

He is a Geologist by profession, he previously worked for BHP and ETSA and is currently the Manager for Uranium SA, which is exploring for uranium at an area 22 kms south of Whyalla on Mullaquanna and Nonowie Stations.

, in an area known as the Pirie Basin.

Their main prospect is an area known as Blackbush, this is 3 km from the sea and the company is currently drilling literally hundreds of exploratory holes to test the range of the uranium.

When in production, they will use the in-situ leaching system, this involves drilling holes above the deposit, which is about 50 metres below the ground and then pumping down a sulphuric acid solution, which dissolves the uranium and then pumping the diluted solution to the surface where it is processed into what is known as yellow cake.

This process means that there is minimal impact to the surrounding land and they will be required to return it, as much as possible to its previous condition.

The price of uranium currently is at \$70/lb, which makes this a significant project.

Alistair stated that the Company intends to use local labour and not have a fly in fly out workforce.

He explained the regulatory requirements required to mine for uranium, these are naturally very stringent and their aim to communicate with the public of Whyalla at all stages of the project.
