Glen Eden

My Early Life

Glen told us that when he was born on, his family owned a farm at Agery, which is on Yorke Peninsula between Kadina and Atherton, as the 6th child in the family. This farm is still in the Eden family.

This was in 1932, which was in the middle of the worst depression in Australia.

There life on the farm was difficult and the work was very hard, with all the children having tasks to do. These including hand milking, which was done before school.

The farm was mixed, with crops and animals and as it was in those days, they grew most of their food. This included butter, which was made and traded to the local shops for supplies.

Horses were very much a part of their life and Glen painted a picture of them ploughing with a team of ten. His brother used them to work on other farms in the area.

He finished high school in 1942 and told us of his early work years, leading up to his joining Elders Smith as a Stock and Station Agent.
