PAUL HARRIS FELLOW

The Rotary movement was founded in February 1905, by Paul Harris, a lawyer from Chicago, who recognized the potential of an association of like-minded professional and business people who could meet and share common interests on a regular basis.

In 1957, the Rotary Foundation launched the Paul Harris Fellowship in memory of the founder as an expression of appreciation for those who have contributed to the Foundation's humanitarian and educational programs.

A contribution of US \$1,000.00 is made to the Rotary Foundation in the name of each individual to be honoured. The recipients receive a pin, medallion and certificates that identify them as advocates of the Foundation's goals of world peace and understanding.



After more than forty years, recognition as a Paul Harris Fellow remains a respected and prestigious honour for Rotarians and non-Rotarians alike.

GUEST SPEAKER

LINDSAY ANDERSON—My EXPERIENCE

Mr Lindsay Anderson is an International Disaster Response Volunteer and he is truly one of the most inspirational speakers we have had the pleasure to listen to. First he mentioned witnessing the wonderful contribution ShelterBoxes have in disaster areas. He told us about the wonderful work the, yellow shirted, Scientology Volunteer Ministers do all over the world. He then told us about some of the disaster areas him and his son Perry had been to for example: Africa; Haiti; Banda Aceh; Samoa; Queensland and Christchurch. The disasters included Tsunami's, floods and earthquakes. He told us the story of the man clinging to a tree, unable to help his family as they passed him in the floods and the maid who witnessed the policeman shoot a security guard in South Africa. Being a trained response volunteer it is his job to 'help victims get up and move on'. Or 'Help fellow volunteers relax then help them sleep so that they can carry on with their work' He told us about the special technique he uses with

people to relive the steps and the trauma to help them finally stop “hearing the water rolling over them or the sound of the gun shot.” There were also some funny tales about he accommodation; the people and the food.

The advice he left us with was: If you wish to volunteer you must go with a reputable organisation; Be open minded to the beliefs of different people; do not try to convert the local people; Human beings are all valuable.
