GUEST SPEAKER

Steve Storic; My life as a professional boxer.



Steve is known in Whyalla as a boxer and a fisherman, he has his own fishing charter business. He is Married to Michelle and they are expecting their first child. Steve was very young when he first got into boxing, he was encouraged by his cousin Nick Klicek. 19 years ago at the age of 11 he weighed 32 Kilos, he was no heavier that a 'sack of spuds'. His first fight was quite memorable for him he went straight in at the deep end, he was so 'nervous he balled his eyes out,' his cousin coaxed him into trying. He wore a big hood to scare off his opponents but underneath it he was just balling. In 1993 he won all seven fights, from this point he just went from strength to strength winning just about everything he entered. By 1997 out of 23 fights he had won 18, he won the SA Champion Gold Medal and went to Tassie and won another Silver Medal. That year his coach passed away and he promised to keep going to win the Australian Gold Medal. When Steve turned 17 he became a senior. He would now be fighting much older opponents and it was hard to find suitable opponents. In 2000 he made the Sydney Olympic reserve team but he had broken two thumbs. By 2004 he had achieved 126 amateur fights and 116 wins. Changes in the points scoring system didn't really suit Steve's style of boxing and he took up coaching. In 2005 he was the only one in Australia to have the Level 3 in Coaching. Following a number of successful years coaching he had two more attempts at boxing this didn't work so he went back to coaching. Then in 2011 he had one last crack at it, he now weighed 67 kilos. Now he found he was doing some really serious training, travelling to Adelaide on a Friday night to do some sparring, he had nose bleeds and a broken Jaw. His first fight was in Adelaide, he was the best prepared he had ever been and he went on to win the 2011 Light Weight Championship—and he has the belt to prove it. He is hanging up his gloves but who knows what the future will bring. He has had a total of 130 fights with 111 wins. He has Eleven SA titles and he is currently the Light Weight Champion Professional.
