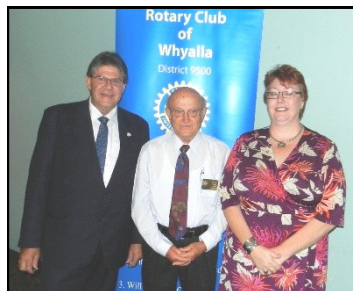

GUEST SPEAKER

Brenton Moi

From South Africa to Australia

Brenton Moi is a tutor of final year dentistry students working at the Oral Health Centre of the UniSA Dental Clinic, having moved straight from South Africa in 2009.

The transition from South Africa was not entirely smooth as his extended family is quite some distance away. However, the lifestyle in Whyalla is agreeable, the weather is similar and family safety is no longer an issue.

Brenton explained that the 90's were vibrant and exciting times in South Africa. Apartheid had ended, Nelson Mandela had been freed, and the Springbok's were world champions. However into the 2000's, the escalation of crime and specific incidents of violence against members of his extended family prompted him to a life-changing decision to move.

Brenton explained that a few adjustments were required in terms of language for even though English is spoken in both countries, he had to learn that Manchester also linen and towels, not simply a city in the UK; Jersey is a cow, not an item of clothing and Tea is an evening meal not only a drink.

Brenton finished by emphasising that he particularly enjoys Whyalla's sense of community, its lifestyle and his permanent residency application is pending. He finds it curious though that although he hasn't been granted approval to practice as a dentist, he does have approval to teach final year dental students!
