Sergeant Jack once again swelled the coffers of the club with his good detective work.

GUEST SPEAKER—Noel Goldsworthy—Fundraising for Brian and Sam

Tonight Noel spoke to us about the reason and the how he raised funds for the two young lads who, in 2010, were tragically left with paraplegia following freak motor cross bike accidents.

In February 2010 Brian Moldenhauer was thrown from his bike while competing in Murray Bridge. Not even a month later Sam White was thrown from his bike at Point Lowly.

At this time Noel was busy organising his holiday to Canberra in the May. When he heard about the young lads he wondered how he would cope with being paralysed. He had just got himself a new bike and thought he could do something to help these boys. Originally he thought he would raise \$24,000 in 24 hours riding to Adelaide and back. The next morning he woke up and thought that was a stupid idea and eventually decided to ride 400 kilometres round Whyalla. Timing was important and he wanted to strike while the iron was hot, before his holiday to Canberra. Everyone will remember the Wheelie bin Noel had which was at the Eyre, The Deli and at the beach—Noel would collect the bin every night and empty it. Within a week and a half he had raised \$25,000. The generosity of people was overwhelming and Noel told us of a couple of tear jerking moments he had. The final total was \$61,745.85c. He still hadn't met the boys but on his return from Canberra he visited them in hospital. He is still in touch and maintains "this was a great part of my life".
