ATTENDANCE AND APOLOGIES

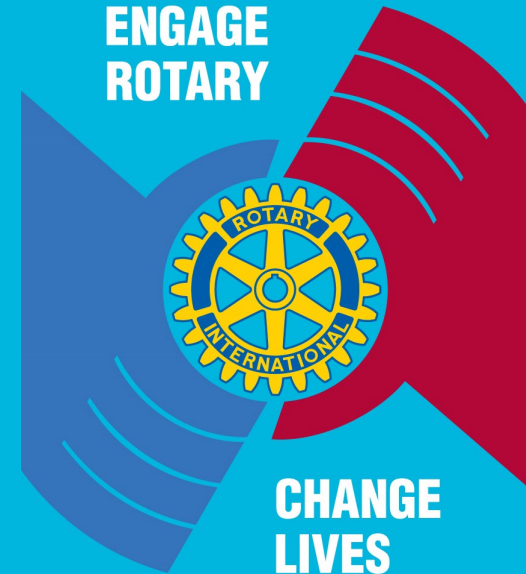

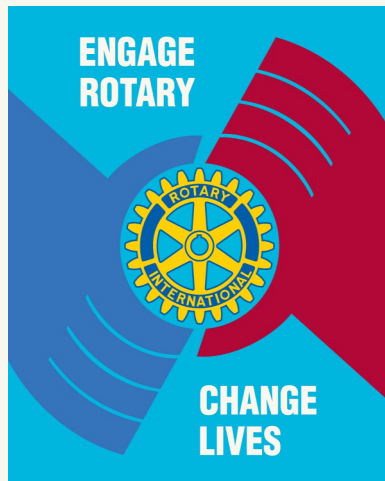
