ATTENDANCE AND APOLOGIES

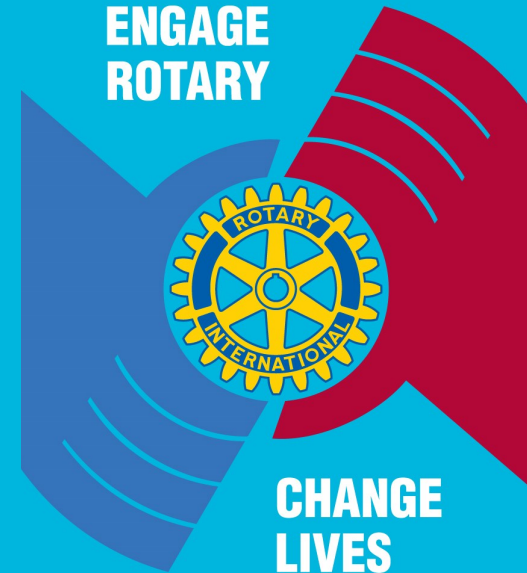

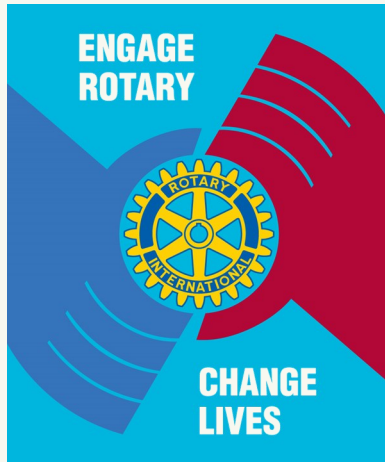

Guest Speaker - Jane and Michelle .—The Mental Health Ball

We were treated to a slide show of images from the Ball. Beautiful table decoration and many smiling faces.

This Ball was a community health awareness event. The previous ball held by the Young Professionals and Tradespeople late last year showed the way with what could be charged per ticket and what could be raised.

Our ball cost \$55 per head for food and \$19 per head bubbly with \$1500 room hire and 200 tickets sold at \$90 or \$100 per head depending on whether the table of 10 was completely sold, for \$7 per head profit.

Sponsorship was crucial for this event to make worthwhile money. Along with the \$1400 generated by ticket sales, \$6800 came from auctions and \$12000 from sponsorships.

The ball appears to have turned an unaudited \$17000.

The cost of a scholarship for the mental health certificate for one nurse is \$8200. The remainder will be used for another as yet undecided mental health initiative.

Lee Martinez was crucial in helping Rotary target mental health correctly in Whyalla.

The three aims of this ball were met, namely:

Raise awareness of mental health

Make money

Show Rotary in a good light - we are not just a bunch of old fuddy duddies.
