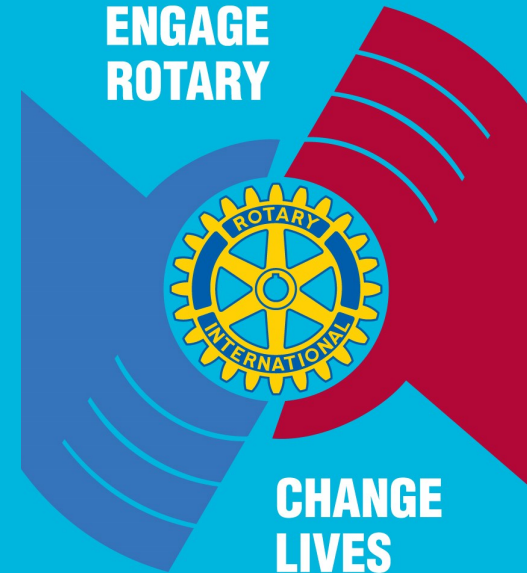

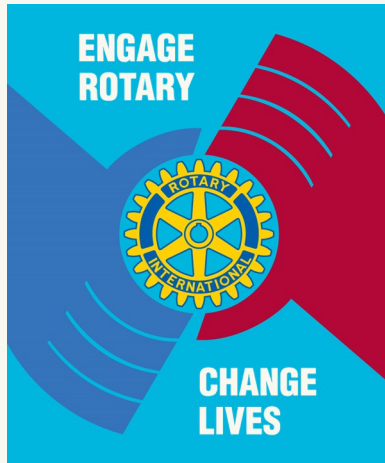

### Guest Speaker Teresa Novak - SA Multicultural and Ethnic Affairs Commission.

The turning point for immigration into Australia was after WW2. Since then 7 million have come from initially the UK, Greece, Italy, Germany, Netherlands, Yugoslavia. The after the Vietnam War the curtain was closed on the white Australia Policy, and so came South East Asians. Today the biggest sources of immigrants are China and India. There are 500 000 international students here currently. 25% of South Australians were born overseas, with half of those coming from non English speaking countries.

Premier Tonkin started the Commission. Multiculturalism adds to the richness of our society. There are 3 regional committees in SA, with Teresa at the head of the Northern.

We have to be vigilant to keep the benefits flowing from multiculturalism.
