Guest Speaker - Jo Krzynowska - a skip up Kilimanjaro

Hiking up Kilimanjaro was on Jo's bucket list, and she waited to do it until after turning 50. It's located on the Kenya / Tanzania border (pronounced "Tanz-ania" just like Tasmania rather than Tanz-an-ia as all the news readers say).

Kilimanjaro is a free standing mountain caused by a volcanic eruption and Jo should know as she's a geologist. It's 5895m above sea level, the tallest free standing mountain (volcano actually) and the highest mountain in Africa. It has 3 peaks, two of which are extinct, but the tallest is only dormant and could erupt again.

It's a 3 hour drive in an old 4WD over a rough road to get to base camp.

## LAST WEEK

Porters carry your gear. It's an "easy" 8 day trek to the top, but you have to ascend slowly as it's common to get altitude sickness above 4000m.

The basecamp is in rain-forest. The trek has a lot of up and down, especially around the 4000m mark. The only wildlife that was seen were black and white monkeys and ravens.

The final ascent was started at midnight, with the aim that people usually have to reach the peak at dawn to see the sunrise and the spectacular view. However, at the speed Jo's party were walking, they took 10 hours to get to the top, so have to take their sunrise photos from near the peak.

No one else was up there when they arrived, which made photography easier, as usually there's a line-up to get the best shots.

Then it was 17 hours down. Going down was quicker but just as hard on the legs going over loose scree.
