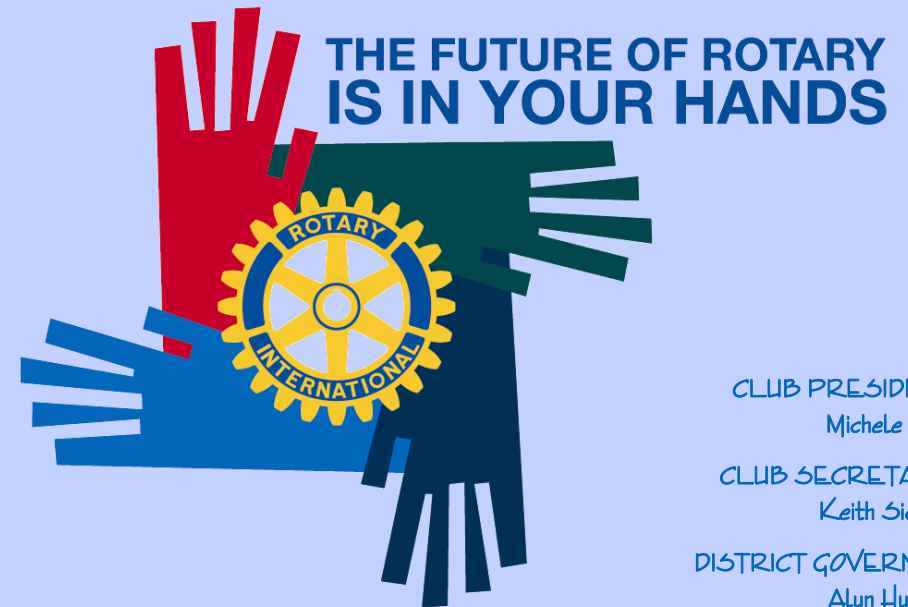
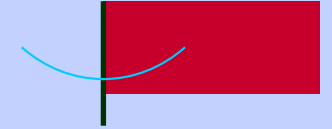
### ATTENDANCE and APOLOGIES

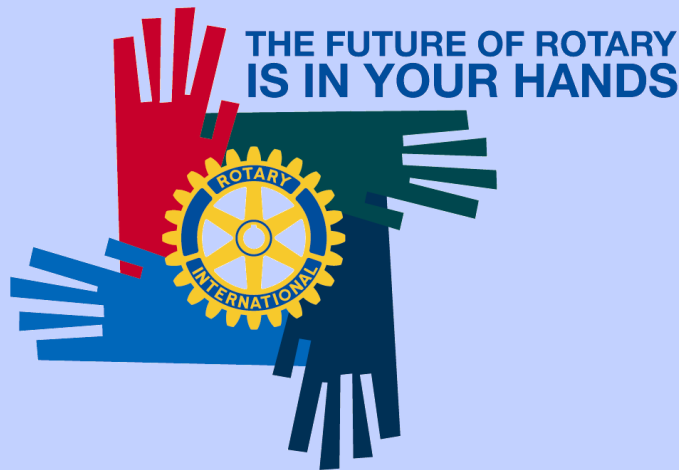

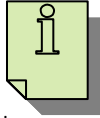

Ryan Sutherland—Middleback Theatre & the Arts

Ryan is a passionate and enthusiastic young woman who is the Venue Manager of the Middleback Theatre here in Whyalla. To start with Ryan gave us a glimpse at her own upbringing and how at a very early age began her love of the arts and the theatre. She then went on to enlighten us with some history and information about the theatre. Going on stage and Ballet were her first loves and to follow this dream she went to dance school in Adelaide. It was here that she discovered that Ballet was not her real forte. Then much later due to health issues became disillusioned and gave the theatre life up and turned her hand to other things. The theatre life was in her blood and eventually she decided that if she could not be on the stage she could at least be around it. After working in Adelaide with some fabulous people and at wonderful venues she returned to Whyalla.

As a child the Middleback Theatre was like a second home for Ryan when her mum Phillipa was theatre manager. It was a versatile venue being used for; Baptisms, weddings, parties etc. It was and still is Whyalla's artistic hub. Over the years the Theatre has continued to move with the times and it now houses the two cinemas. The Foyer Gallery is the perfect location for the Whyalla Art Prize and its impressive art works.
