



This was not the first time Clare has been the Guest Speaker at Rotary. She remembered fondly her previous visit. Clare told us about her own life and how she had come to Whyalla; from being keen on hospitality; her exciting years at the Hyatt; having her own business; having her children and coming to Whyalla with her, then, partner.
