THE LIGHTER SIDE

FIRST NAMES OR NICKNAMES

From the earliest days of Rotary, members have referred to each other on a first-name basis. Since personal acquaintanceship and friendship are cornerstones of Rotary, it was natural that many clubs adopted the practice of setting aside formal titles in conversations among members. Individuals who normally would be addressed as Doctor, Professor, Mister, the Honorable or Sir are regularly called Joe, Bill, Mary, Karen or Chancy by other Rotarians. The characteristic Rotary club name badge fosters the first-name custom.

In a few areas, such as Europe, club members use a more formal style in addressing fellow members. In other parts of the world, mainly in Asian countries, the practice is to assign each new Rotarian a humorous nickname which relates to some personal characteristic or which is descriptive of the member's business or profession. A member nicknamed "Oxygen" is the manufacturer of chemical gas products. "Trees" is the nickname for the Rotarian in the lumber business, "Building" is the contractor, "Paper" is the stationery or office supply retailer. Other members might carry nicknames like "Muscles," "Foghorn" or "Smiles" as commentaries on their physical features.

The nicknames are frequently a source of good-natured fun and fellow-ship. But whether a Rotarian is addressed by a given first name or a nickname, the spirit of personal friendship is the initial step that opens doors to all other opportunities for service.

GUEST SPEAKER

Insp. Scott Denny

This week members were treated to a special vocational visit when Insp Scott Denny gave us a guided tour of the Whyalla Police Station.

The area that Scott is responsible for is the 2nd largest in area in South Australia and takes in Kimba, Ceduna, Port Lincoln and Whyalla. That involves managing approx. 140 police officers and admin staff. The Rotarians however were most interested in visiting the cells and inspecting the current patrol cars.

One of the things which became apparent as we toured was that the current police officer, whilst always being ready to assist and present the helpful public face, must also confront the dangerous and unpredictable edge of society.

The eight cells were bare and uncompromising and not a place to spend a comfortable evening. There is even a padded cell to ensure that violent prisoners have a place to calm down without harming either themselves or the police officers.

The most frequent tenants are those under the influence of alcohol or drugs and those arrested for criminal offences who are often moved to Pt. Augusta for detention. Although nobody was in occupation this evening, often up to 30 - 40 people can pass through in any given week. These days everyone is electronically fingerprinted and DNA tested so that once you are in the 'system' there is no where to hide.

The Patrol Car was hi-tech, high performance and fully accessorised. The additional equipment means that the car weighs 2t rather than the 1.1t which the standard Holden VE Series II 3l V6 would weigh. However the engine is tweaked a little to compensate.

Members were also intrigued by what police officers carry on their belt, but that's only for those who were there, to know.
