Thomas is a Year12 Student at Caritas College in Pt. Augusta, who was smart enough to nominate for the National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) in Canberra during January 2012. Furthermore, he was smart enough to be accepted.


The National Youth Science Forum is a twelve day program for students moving into Year 12 and who are thinking about a career in science, engineering and technology.

Rotary has been in partnership with the program since 1984 and entry is very competitive and by necessity, the criteria for acceptance into the program is high. Thomas said that they looked for good communication and social skills, leadership potential and of course a passion for science.

The program includes dinners with some of Australia's pre-eminent scientists, Lab visits, Forums, Lectures and field visits. Students are there not to learn science, but to experience it. There were forums and debates on Ethics & Science, Bio-technology and World Issues as well as interviews and speeches. One of the interviews was for that dream science job!

Thomas said that there was much to be gained from the experience, with motivation, confidence, experiences (there is nothing like this anywhere in the world), new friends and an experience which helped him plan his future, being the main benefits for him.

Thomas' interest is in environmental and earth sciences and he now has a clearer view of what shape he wants his career to take. His first step however is to attain his Bachelor of Environmental Science from Flinders University. We know he will do well.
