**GUEST SPEAKER**

Cheryl Norton - All about me!

Another one of those fabulous times when Rotarians give of themselves and relate their life story. Cheryl Norton has been coming to Rotary meetings for quite a number of years as the partner of Past President Jari, but is now a fully fledged member in her own right, but if we thought you knew her well before, we know much more about her now.

Arriving at Blackwood in the year of her birth, Cheryl spent her early childhood at Copley, where her grandfather had built the roadhouse, and subsequently moved to Alice Springs where she has many fond memories, going camping and visiting Kakadu before it became famous.

Her involvement in community service came through St. John Ambulance where she quickly became a Sergeant. She said this was "so that she could boss the other kids around."

Back to the Adelaide Hills and as a 14 year-old she spent time helping out at the Kalyra Rehab Hospital where she began assisting and caring for those in palliative care and those coping with mental illnesses and her life's calling became apparent. Cheryl has worked in this field in various capacities for nearly all of her working life, from St. Andrews Private Hospital to Glenside and Daw Park Rehab caring for Vietnam Vet's.

Cheryl mentioned that a key aspect and change she has noticed in the treating of patients with mental illnesses has been the de-institutionalising of patient care. Dealing with the fallout and lack of care and support provided to these members of our community is Cheryl's biggest criticism of the system.

In 2004 she met Jari and a move to Whyalla followed where she initially worked for Wesley Uniting Care. The last two years have been spent in Pt. Augusta with the local Mental Health Team, but we are so glad she decided to join our Rotary Club!
