otary clubs around the globe have many things in common, including a commitment to service. Here's a roundup of recent club activities worldwide:

Afghanistan

After 5,000 vaccine carriers from Rotary International were delivered to Afghanistan, a ceremony was held in January at which the deputy minister of public health thanked Rotary for its work to eradicate polio in the country – one of three where the disease remains endemic. Officials from the World Health Organization, UNICEF, and USAID attended, and Rotary's International PolioPlus Committee Chair Robert S. Scott, Pakistan PolioPlus Committee Chair Aziz Memon, and two members of the Rotary Club of Kabul received recognition.

Turkey

Breast cancer is the most common form of the disease among women in Turkey, accounting for 24% of all cases. But diagnoses and survival rates differ in urban and rural areas; in less-developed regions, most cases are not diagnosed until the late stages, and more people die within five years of diagnosis than in developed regions. Rotarians in District 2440 are working with District 6780 (Tennessee, USA) on a Health, Hunger and Humanity Grant project to educate women about breast health and early detection of breast cancer. The effort focuses on areas of Izmir Province that the Turkish Ministry of Health has identified as medically underserved.
