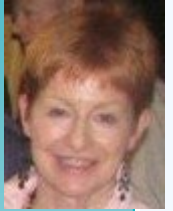

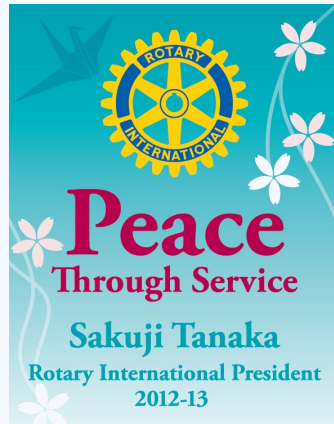

Children in Mwandi are left as orphans to fend for themselves after their widowed mother re-marries. Basic services such as power & water are being provided by this amazing group of time generous folk not afraid of the local conditions nor hard work. A wonderful, heart rending depiction of third world life & those who can, doing what they can to improve the lot of Zambians in Mwandi. All these efforts are sustainable with the local people being shown & trained to build, sew, cultivate & generally encouraged to become self sufficient to the extent their conditions allow.
