ATTENDANCE AND APOLOGIES

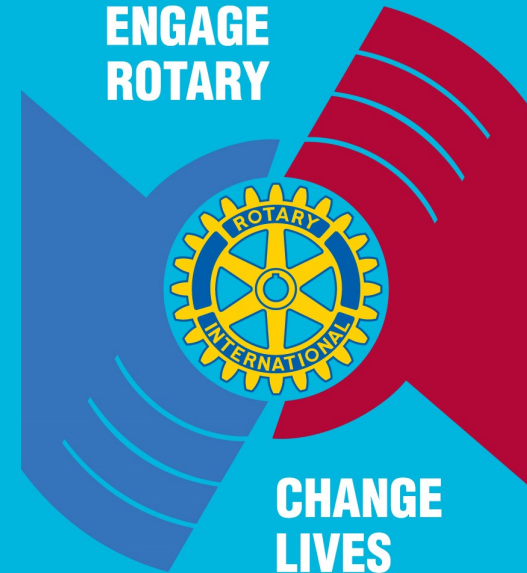

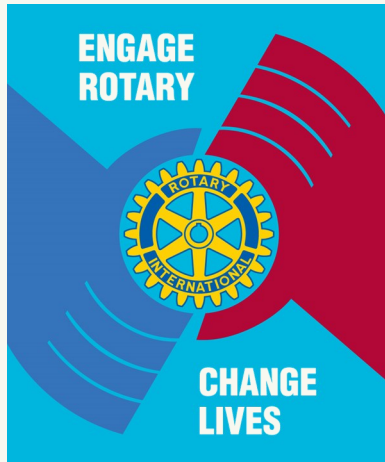
